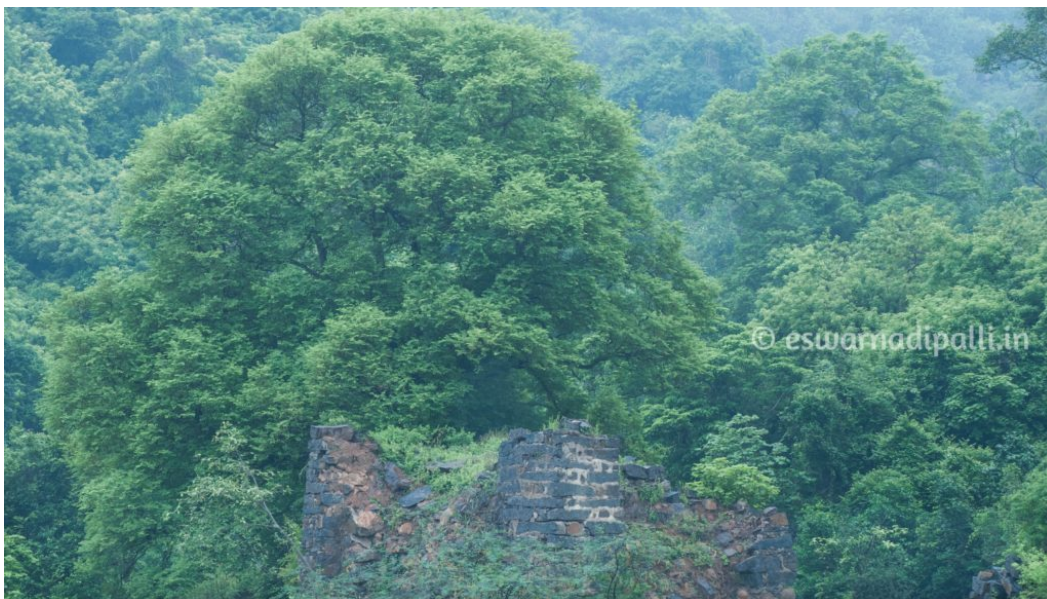

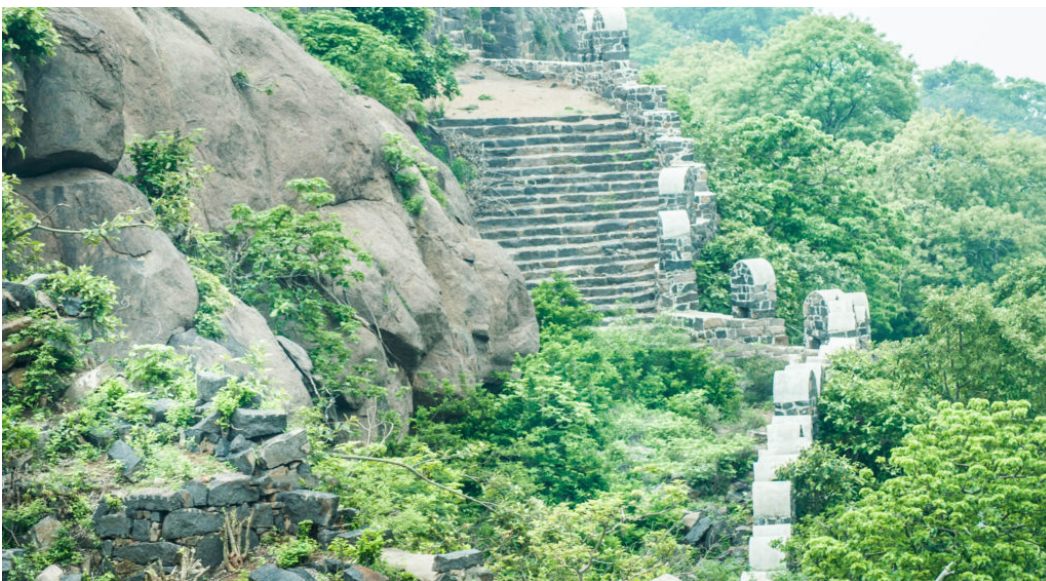
Enjoying the scenery, taken over by my thoughts, I asked myself, "How I missed this fertile green lushness for these many years?"
